The Habitat model works because of faithful donors and volunteers.

Volunteers contribute over 2,500 hours per home to build hope in our partner families' lives.

In 2017, 92.4 cents of every dollar went into building homes.

Habitat homeowner's monthly mortgage payments are reinvested and build one home per year.

Partner families must qualify for an affordable 30 year mortgage & make a \$1,000 down payment.

The affordable mortgage payment for a Habitat home ranges between \$450-\$650 month which includes property taxes & insurance.

Each partner family invests over 300 hours of "sweat equity".

Since 1995, a total of 94 families have been helped in North St. Louis County.
