Since our founding in 1995, we have worked, together with you, to help 111 families in 15 communities into homes. This summer we will be building homes with five families. The first foundation is being built in Virginia in partnership with Mariah Krulich and Kingston (pictured above). With your help to turn the page on subsidized housing, she will be starting a new chapter in an energy efficient home—a base from which to weather the types of challenges that our world has hurled at us over the last couple of years. The excitement is building...and it is evident in their faces! Though putting in foundations is no easy task, our volunteers are also excited to jump into the building season to do this and all the other tasks involved with building a Habitat home. Our newest board member, Rolf Swanson (also pictured above) was happy to be working with Mariah to build her home. He invites you to come join him, even if it just one day, you will enjoy it!

In this newsletter you will meet our five new partner families for this year. We invite you to join in the excitement of helping them put down firm foundations in Buhl (2), Chisholm, Hibbing and Virginia. The current economic challenges that we are under only serve to strengthen our resolve to help these families succeed. I often think that if life is hard from me right now, I can only **imagine** what it is like for our low income neighbors who are struggling in substandard housing. WE TAKE OUR BIKE RIDING SERIOUSLY! - HABITAT 500 BIKE RIDE FUNDRAISER

Hello, I'm Greg Krog and I will be participating in the Habitat 500 Bike Ride Fundraiser for the 13th time this year. I have served on the North St. Louis County Habitat for Humanity board since 2014 taking one year off in 2020 for term limits. I returned to the board in 2021 and am in my second year of serving as the board president.

I believe in hard work. I am privileged to lead this organization and personally witness the hard work that our board, staff, volunteers and partner families put into the mission of building affordable homes. Our families are not given a home, we work with them to build one which they buy from Habitat through an affordable mortgage.

This year, I and six of my fellow bike riders will be riding in the Habitat 500. Some will participate in the virtual ride (riding from home and logging their miles), others will come together for a three day ride in Fergus Falls. All have committed to riding their bikes to help raise funds for our five home projects this year.

This is our main summer fundraising event. Each of us are contacting our friends and neighbors and asking them to support us in this cause by giving a donation to help build homes. I would like to ask you to consider donating in honor of our efforts to help our neighbors. Simply make your donation to Habitat for Humanity and designate a rider, or all of us on the envelope provided. We will keep you in our thoughts as we ride and you will help energize our legs as we pedal to help our neighbors in need!

CLOSING SOON!


Two families will soon close on their homes and begin the adventure of homeownership. By making their affordable monthly mortgage payment, they will not only provide a home for their families, they will be helping us help more families into simple, decent and affordable homes. The principal portion of their payment pays down their loan and goes into our Fund for Humanity. This fund allows us to partner with even more families in North St. Louis County! In addition, these families will be adding to the tax base in their communities by paying property taxes.

Lacy Podlogar's home was built in partnership with the Hibbing High School and Hibbing Community College. Lacy has been involved in every aspect of building her home and homes of other homebuilders in the program. She simply wanted to learn everything she could about building a home. "I just liked learning in general. The thing I probably liked the most was doing the flooring."

Sheryl Lamppa's home was built in partnership with the Mesabi Range College Carpentry program. Sheryl, along with her daughter Brianna, have been busy working together to finish up interior and exterior painting as well as shopping for light fixtures, a bathroom vanity and kitchen hardware. When asked what they look forward to the most, Brianna said she is looking forward to painting her bedroom. Sheryl looks forward to decorating her home anyway she wants and having a yard so that she can have a garden once again.

One of the first decisions our homebuilders make is which house plan they want to build. They have the opportunity to choose from five 3-bedroom plans. Lacy and Sheryl picked the same house plan and have been excited to see their home go from a plan on paper to a home that they will soon finish and then purchase with an affordable mortgage. In addition to picking their house plan, they also choose the color of their shingles, exterior paint color and exterior doors.

With the support of our volunteers, donors and pray partners, these plans went from drawings to homes. From our families to yours, thank you!
