We are building a home in Hibbing with community volunteers! We are seeking an individual to help us make this "community build" a success. The site supervisor will communicate with Habitat's construction manager, Steve Burgess, and community resources manager, Susan Garrett, to coordinate the days that volunteers will be on site and the tasks that need to be completed on those days. Duties will include welcoming volunteers, having them fill out the Volunteer Waiver Form, signing in and giving the morning safety talk. The site supervisor will provide construction supervision and coordination for the duration of the volunteer workday and work to facilitate a

positive and supportive atmosphere for volunteers. Due to the special skills required and the responsibility that this position carries, North St. Louis County Habitat for Humanity can offer the site supervisor a stipend of \$100/day.
